

# **80% of New Yorkers Support Calorie Labeling; Few New Yorkers Can Correctly Estimate Highest or Lowest Calorie Items on Chain Restaurant Menus**

*Zogby International Poll*

*April, 2008*

New Yorkers support state legislation that would require fast food and other chain restaurants to display calorie information on menus and menu boards. *80% say they would support a bill similar to what was passed in New York City to require those chains and fast food establishments to show the calorie count for their offerings.*

Few respondents could identify items with the fewest or most calorie items on chain restaurant menus.

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Zogby International was commissioned by the Center for Science in the Public Interest and NYSHEPA to conduct a telephone survey of adults in New York from 4/4/08 to 4/6/08. The target sample is 909 interviews with approximately 55 questions asked.

Up to six calls are made to reach a sampled phone number. Cooperation rates are calculated using one of AAPOR's approved methodologies<sup>1</sup> and are comparable to other professional public-opinion surveys conducted using similar sampling strategies.<sup>2</sup> Weighting by region, education, age, race, religion and gender is used to adjust for non-response. The margin of error is +/- 3.3 percentage points. Margins of error are higher in sub-groups.
